THE KNACK OF **Serving**

Acts 9:36-43

What is our purpose in life? All the logical things - to work, make money, get through school, to have recognition. *Maybe.* Purpose can be seen through a new lens when using our friend Tabitha as an example of purpose in life- "...always doing good and helping the poor". Tabitha was a seamstress and sewed clothing for the widows and needy in her town of Joppa. Very talented, and much appreciated Tabitha was - so when she died her community was crushed and wanted to honor her. Enter stage right, the Apostle Peter, to whom the townspeople showed all the wonderful things Tabitha had made and shared her story with him.



Peter's purpose? At that moment in time, it was to bring Tabitha back to life. Now, Tabitha knew her purpose was to serve, but her faithful service did not spare her from sickness and death. **It's an important reminder: good works cannot cancel out sin and they cannot buy eternal life.**

Peter raised Tabitha back to life, not because she had earned it, but because Jesus had already conquered death for her, and Christ has done the same for us. Just like Tabitha, we will all face death because we live in a fallen world. **But** - like Tabitha, we also have hope, because Jesus' resurrection guarantees forgiveness for all of us. By Tabitha's restoration to life, many people were brought to personal faith in Christ!

Why Do We Serve, how do we get the Knack of Serving? Jesus' words say why: **"Love each other as I have loved you."** We get the knack to find some way to be Christ for others, through practical acts of love by serving with what we can do: folding bulletins, cooking meals, visiting the sick, sewing, fixing, encouraging, praying, teaching, listening, painting, finance, handy-man, and whatever we can do, and know every act matters in God's kingdom!

What gifts has God given you? What opportunities has He placed before you? Just do something, and step into the purpose God has given you.

Remember the words of the Apostle Peter in his letter (1 Peter 4:10): **"Each one should use whatever gift he [or she] has received to serve others, faithfully administering God's grace in its various forms"**. The Knack of Serving **has a Promise**, on the Last Day, Christ will look us in the eye and say, **"Well done, good and faithful servant. Come and take your inheritance, come into the kingdom prepared for you since the creation of the world."**

That, my friends, is why we serve, that is the Knack of Serving!
